


CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS



ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE




ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2014-15.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Our school's long-term goals continue to be focused on improving our graduation rates. We believe that this can be done by helping our students to regularly attend school. Our goal is to have over 80% of our students attending school regularly. We work with students and families to inform them of the importance of regular attendance. Our school is also focused on keeping students on track for graduation. We would like our freshmen on track for graduation to reach 90% in the next two years.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% ontime, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

The first priority at RHS is to provide a safe and secure learning environment. Through partnerships with our community, we provide a full time School Resource Officer, fully staffed teen health center, and numerous mental health services on our campus. We also strive to ensure that each student has a strong connection with adults on our campus. This is done through a strong PBIS system, social emotional learning, and numerous clubs, activities and programs. RHS wants every student and family to feel safe and welcomed on our campus.







